We plan on having many of our local civic and community leaders speak at this year's conference. We want to bring a more business minded prospective to our personal development portion, and what better way to do this then get an outside perspective on new and initiative ways to move forward. 

Membership Principles

Now that 2019 is in the rearview mirror, let's take a look at how we are membership numbers are as an AFSA Chapter for the year. 2019 was a pretty decent year, our local chapter held 11 membership drives while recruiting 52 new AFSA members. Additionally, we were able to retain 3 personnel. That puts Chapter 951 at 548 active members as we roll in the New Year. 2020 will bring some pretty significant issues for AFSA across the globe.

Membership will be a huge problem across the entire AFSA organization. In 2015, AFSA rolled out a 5-year membership incentive. This incentive greatly increased the organizations overall numbers, however those memberships are all due to expire over the next 12 months. Our local chapter alone will lose 231 of its current members if we cannot retain these personnel.

In an attempt to assist with the re-occurring retention issue, the AFSA Head Quarters executive council has budgeted for and set aside \$66,000 to fund the initial purchase, implementation, and first year maintenance fees for the Auto Pay "Set It Forever" payment option. There is not an official start date for this option as of today's article, but hopes are to have eat rollout early next year. This new auto payment option should assist our organization with maintaining our current membership numbers without the issue of losing over 1/3 of its force due to expiring memberships each and every year. Please take a look at the "Market Place AFSA Demo" power point slide show on the AFSA homepage at HQAFSA.org for more information. Additionally, our local chapter will bring in the new year by planning to conduct monthly membership drives at the main exchange with the first one scheduled for 24 January from 1100 to 1400 hours.

Please come out and assist while spreading the word that becoming a member gives assists in providing the voice we need to take action and assist with various bills being enacted. Throughout the year the organization lobbies for numerous bills in support of our military benefits. Currently, some of the legislations that AFSA is working to push through congress are to repeal the law that reduces military Survivor Benefit Plan annuities, repeal the law that reduces military retirement pay for those with members with service-connected disability compensated and received from the Veterans Affairs, acting to stop reductions in military pay raises and to ensure relative comparability with private sector wages, acting to repel all attempts to close or eliminate military commissaries and exchanges and, numerous others.

For the cost of an AFSA membership, \$36 for a one year, \$63 for two and \$89 for three, you can ensure your benefits are being protected. Life memberships are also available: Age 40 and under \$650, Age 41 - 50 \$550, Age 51 - 60 \$450, and age 61 and over at \$350. We urge you to let your voice be heard--become an AFSA member and let's have our issues and concerns be heard and continue to preserve our benefits and privileges.

Then when we are finally finished they once again treated us to pizza. What a way to end the morning.

To end the year I was reelected as the Chapter's Family Matters Trustee. My plans for 2020 are to find a way to bring in more spouse to be involved with the Chapter. Whether it is encouraging our current members to sign up their spouses or speaking to couples who come up to our table during a membership drive. In case you didn't already know, a family member is everyone from a spouse, kids over the age of 18, parents, siblings and pretty much anyone in your family who does not already qualify to be a regular AFSA member.

Also I want to point out a special opportunity for new members who sign up for AFSA. When you join now you receive a scholarship for one course from Columbia Southern University. 


